58% of all A Level passes were achieved at grades A* and A.

52 students each claimed 3 A^*/A grades leading the School to a 100% A Level Pass Rate for the 8th year in succession.

88% of pupils were awarded places at their first or second choice universities.

At GCSE the School achieved 77% of all grades at A^*/A ; this is a record for the school. The average number of passes per pupil was 10 and 22 pupils achieved $8\,A^*$ grades or better.

The set design by Mrs Fair and Mr K Hunton was visually appealing, created by Mr K Leach and other members of the maintenance team. The production was a real team effort with contributions from several areas of the school community.

In the Summer term, Middle School pupils put on a version of *Beauty and the Beast*. Directed by Miss H Pike assisted by Miss L Rutherford, this was performed outdoors in the amphitheatre next to the Junior School. The weather stayed kind and the audience were treated to a fabulous summer's evening of fine entertainment and Pimms.
