







Fame the musical is based on the 1980s film and a six season TV series.

The Musical is significantly rewritten from the previous screen adaptations, with an almost entirely new score except for the title Academy Award-winning song, 'Fame'. The musical takes over where the film ends, with a new intake of pupils and follows them over their four years at New York City's High School for Performing Arts (PA), from their admission in 1980 to their graduation in 1984.

We meet fame-obsessed Carmen, ambitious actress Serena, quiet musician Schlomo, talented but illiterate dancer Tyrone, determined actor Nick, food loving dancer Mabel, wisecracking comedian Joe, and the financially strapped dancer Iris. We see them coming to terms with life and relationships; we see those who persevere, who are resilient - and those who are not. Above all, we see them perceiving the need to strive for excellence.

With a little bit of 'Hard Work' and a whole lot of 'Dancin' on the Sidewalk', they finally learn what it means to achieve 'Fame'.

Fame is an international sensation that continues to reach new generations of performers and audience members, with high-octane musical numbers, toe-tapping dances and a lot of fun!

After being so close to performing *Little Shop of Horrors* last year and *Twelfth Night* the year before, we started *Fame* with so much excitement and enthusiasm, which has grown exponentially throughout the rehearsal process. Most of us have fond memories of *Fame*, whether it is the original 1980 film, the subsequent TV series, the stage musical (I saw the original UK tour as a teen and loved it!) or the more recent 2009 film. The musical has a toe tapping score, high energy numbers, numerous speaking roles, large chorus involvement, a range of dance styles and a serious message underneath... beyond that it is really good fun – there really is something for everyone!

However, there are several challenges performing Fame - one is the multiple scenes that happen in quick succession, containing only short sections of dialogue. The danger is these scenes are short and choppy and don't flow due to scene changes, with the pace of the show dropping. This was a real challenge for Mr Hunton, as we were really keen to design a composite set which enabled multiple locations within the school setting and the ability to change between them quickly and smoothly. Mr Hunton's fantastic design certainly does this! Another challenge is the huge chorus numbers. The opening, for example, is approximately 12 minutes long, containing dialogue, storytelling, acting through song, complex staging and a full blown dance break. Personally, I really enjoy setting large chorus numbers and the challenges they contain and it has been wonderful to see the numbers grow and develop each week, watching the performance journey of our amazing cast. Adding tables on wheels and a lunch hall full of chairs has been a particular challenge for the cast (and stage crew), but they have risen to it admirably and now can add 'table'ography' to their list of skills - which has been so much fun in rehearsals!

The cast have risen to every challenge we have posed them and approached rehearsals with enthusiasm and professionalism. I have been so proud of the way they have persevered through rehearsals, worked so hard and had so much fun along the way. They have been such a pleasure to work with and it has been a privilege to see them grow and develop alongside their characters and the production.

As always, this production has been a real team effort.

A huge thank you to all involved, in whatever capacity and to the school community for being so supportive and helping us to ensure that with a lot of 'hard work', we will all be able to 'make magic', leaving the theatre 'dancin on the sidewalk', and 'flying high'!

Even though we were cut short of bringing *Twelfth Night* to an audience (2020), and *Little Shop of Horrors* (2021) was only seen by part of the Thirds year group in a single performance, both companies had the wonderful experience of working on the productions and engaging with the drama, music and staging. I am sure that all involved will still have very happy memories of the journey we all had working together towards a shared goal.

If the mood takes you, please do tap your toes to the energy of the music – or perhaps even get up on your feet and boogie! Whichever you decide, I really hope you leave with a huge smile on your face.

With the design for 'Fame', we strived to visually combine the streets of New York with the inside spaces of the Performing Arts School, to create a single world on stage. The concept was then also spread to the costumes, with 1980s influence and elements of 'street art' used in the set decoration.

Its truly brilliant to have seen an influx of enthusiam from both staff and students getting involved, with many backstage roles in set and costume design, scenic art, props, construction and make-up.

Notably, Hermione Hoopper, Sophie Storey and Shaya Moeini have devoted time to shadow the entire design process from 'page to stage'. This is the first time we have seen students taking these levels of responsibility for principle design roles on a Solihull musical!
