### A LEVEL & GCSE RESULTS

100% pass rate at A Level and GCSE.

85% of ALL A Level passes were achieved at grades A\*/A and B (which equals the best ever).

37 students each claimed 3 A\*/A grades leading the School to a 100% A Level Pass Rate for the 7th year in succession.

88% of pupils were awarded places at their first or second chosen universities.

Finally, well done to all the assigned year group Captain's; Darryl Brotherhood, William Davies, Usama Rahman, William Rigg, Nicholas Starkey and Benny Watson who have lead their teams well throughout the season. Darryl Brotherhood has also been awarded 1st XI Cricket Colours for his contribution to the sport over the past three seasons.

### Equestrian

The Equestrian team represented the school at the NSEA (National Schools' Equestrian Association) National Championships at Addington in October. School riders also attended Bloxham School's Eventers' Challenge in September and the Princethorpe and Kingsley Dressage and Show jumping events in April.

Individually, Georgia Lovett qualified for and competed at the Horse of the Year Show in show jumping, was selected for the British Masters and is a member of the England HPI 148 team.

### Fencing

The last 12 months have seen some great successes for Solihull School's fencing team. Matthew Tyler retained his title as Warwickshire Regional Champion and finished the year ranked 5th within the West Midlands for his age group. Faye Kent qualified 3rd in the West Midlands Epee Qualifiers which entitled her to represent the region in the British Youth Championships which were held in May. Faye finished the year ranked 34th in the British Youth Fencing Scheme. Throughout the year fencers from Solihull School won various medals and awards, the fencers were; Matthew Tyler, Faye Kent, Fraser Waddle, Ewan Waddle and Katie Williams. Sam Griffiths qualified as a Level-1 Epee Coach and Matthew Tyler qualified as a Level-1 Fencing Referee.

### Golf

Golf at Solihull School goes from strength to strength. For the third time in three successive years (2010: ISGA Matchplay, 2011 HMC Foursomes) the Senior Squad have become regional winners of one of the major independent school golf competitions. This year the boys became ISGA Plate champions after defeating Princethorpe in the final which was played at the Welcombe Hotel and Country Club in Stratford-upon-Avon. The team was captained by Will Harland (handicap: 6). The other members of the singles squad include George Taylor (handicap: 6) and Stefan Gnyla (handicap: 3). Will scored 33 points, whilst both George and Stefan secured 34 points each. This gave the boys a total of 101 points, which easily defeated Princethorpe's 78 points. The team's performance on this day was made more remarkable due to the testing conditions that they had to face. They battled through driving rain and wind on an already challenging par 72 course to defeat their opponents. They now progress to the national finals which will be played at the prestigious Shire Golf Club near London. The course, which was designed by Seve Ballesteros was recently voted as one of the top 100 courses in the world. It is a wonderful opportunity for the team to have the chance to experience it.

## Skiing

At the English ESSKIA Championships the U19 Girls' Team – Amy Middleton, Helena Newbould, Hannah Shakeshaft and Libby Thomas – were crowned 2nd fastest U16 girls' team in England on day one and fastest girls' team in England in the open age group on day two. As a result, the team was selected to represent England at the British Schools Ski Championships at Hillend in Edinburgh.

At the English ESSKIA Championships the U19 girls had two very successful days being crowned 2nd fastest U16 girls team in England on day one and then on the 2nd day fastest girls team in England in the open age group. From this the team was selected to represent England at the British Schools Ski Championships at Hillend in Edinburgh. At over 400m long, the slope is the longest in the UK and the faster skiers can reach average speeds of 60km per hour coming down that hill.

A 27 gate course was set which was going to test all competitors. Two hundred skiers; twenty five boys' teams and twenty three girls' teams were competing from schools across England, Scotland and Wales. Looking down from the top of the slope at a very technical course can be daunting but the girls skied excellently. We finished 5th overall which is a brilliant achievement. Libby Thomas came 4th, Amy Middleton 9th, Helena Newbould 47th and Hannah Shakeshaft 62nd. Due to their excellent skiing the entire team was invited to a training week in Norway with the English Schools Team and Libby Thomas was selected for the ISF race. To have all four member of a team invited is extremely rare!

## DRAMA

There were three productions in the Christmas Term. Lower School Drama Club presented a double bill comprising of an ensemble production of *Us and Them* by David Campton. This was a simple yet, thought-provoking play with an anti-war message and used lighting, sound and projection to great effect. The second part of the bill *Sherlock Holmes and the Emerald of Alcazar* by Geoff Bamber was a complete contrast being a very funny spoof of the great detective and his right-hand man Doctor Watson, played in the style of melodrama. Both plays were directed by Mrs J Wilde and the music was provided by Mr G Cureton on the piano. Dr P Jukes and Mr P Hadley managed the productions.

Middle School presented the Greek tragedy *Oedipus Rex* by Sophocles. Pupils rose admirably to the challenge of this demanding piece with Harry Morgan taking the central role of the doomed King Oedipus. This challenging piece was directed by Mrs J Johnson. This production formed part of an evening of Greek Theatre, for which the Sixth Form presented a further Greek Tragedy – *Burial at Thebes*, Seamus Heaney's translation of Sophocles' *Antigone*, which was performed in modern dress and made creative use of technology. Directed by Miss H Pike, the production had many excellent performances, including Sam Weighall's powerful interpretation of Creon and Nicola Cronin's compelling Antigone.

In the Easter term Mrs Wilde, with Mr Perrins as Musical Director, directed students in *Fiddler on the Roof*, which played to packed houses for five nights. Tom Wilde gave a superb all round performance as Tevye, delivering classics like *If I Were A Rich Man* with great energy and delivering the beautifully written script with perfect comic timing. The production boasted a very strong cast with Emily White as Golde; Amelia Whittaker as Yente; Sally Farrant, Florentina Harris and Julie Whiting as Tevye's daughters Tzeitel, Hodel and Chava and David Cobbald, Oscar Street and Joe Singer as their suitors Motel Kamzoil, Perchik and Fyedka. There were some challenging and effective dance routines choreographed by former pupil Samantha Mason.

In the summer term, Lower School pupils put on *Rockafella*, a musical by Les Scott, Roy Oakes and Ken Bolam. Directed by Mrs J Wilde, this was performed in the Leonard Stevens building and played to packed houses for two nights. Mr G Cureton was Musical Director and also played keyboard;

Mr D Farrington played guitar and Mr P Hadley provided the set and lighting.

Lower School Drama Club has flourished, with up to 30 Lower School pupils regularly attending on Tuesday lunchtime. This is in large part due to the commitment of Sixth Form students and IVth form pupils who have run the sessions. Participants have enjoyed creating short improvised plays and developing their skills through theatre games.
