

Election 2019 - have your say!

The UK election in December is one of the most important in a generation - it will decide whether we leave or remain in the European Union, how much is spent on schools and hospitals, even whether schools like this continue to exist! Jack Arrowsmith, Conservative Party

The Brexit Referendum has been deeply divisive for Britain: abandoning Brexit would be a betrayal of 17.4 million people who voted to leave and as democrats we can't let that happen; but we must implement it in a way which protects jobs and living standards. The Prime Minister has negotiated a deal which will allows us to fully leave the EU in an orderly way, and strike our own Free Trade Agreements with countries around the world.

Delivering Brexit will allow the government to focus on the NHS, Education, Climate Change and Crime reduction. The scale of public spending proposed by Labour will again saddle the country with massive debt, which future generations will have to repay.
