- *How do I apply?*

Complete a registration form which can be found on our website. Hard copy needs to be returned to Solihull School with a copy of birth certificate, passport, a small photograph and the registration fee of £75

- *When is the closing date for Senior School applications?*

Tuesday 15 September 2020

- *When is the Senior School Entrance Examination?*

Saturday 7 November 2020

- *Where can we find sample papers of the examinations?*

On our Solihull School website

- *What Scholarships do you offer at 11+?*

All children who sit our entrance examination are automatically entered for an Academic Scholarship. Solihull also offer Co-curricular Scholarships in Art, Music and Sport

- *Do you offer Sports Scholarships for all sports?*

No, only Cricket, Hockey, Netball and Rugby

- *Can you apply for more than one Scholarship?*

Yes

- *What is the difference between a Scholarship and a Bursary?*

A Scholarship is awarded to the child on their ability and merit. A Bursary is means tested on parents' financials

You need to complete the Scholarship form on our website and return to Solihull School along with the completed registration form and relevant documentation

- *How do I apply for a Bursary?*

By submitting a letter at the time of registration

- *What examinations do the children sit?*

At 11+ and 12+, they sit English and Maths

At 13+ and 14+, they sit English, Maths, Science and a MFL (French, German or Spanish)

- *Do they sit Verbal and Non-Verbal reasoning papers?*

- *When is the Academic Scholarship exam?*

Tuesday 26 January. The general Academic Scholarship exam is a one-hour multiple choice paper designed to test critical thinking and problem-solving skills. Sample paper can be found on our website. Candidates will usually be predicted Grade 8 in at least six subjects
